## Volunteer Medical Team Role Description

### **MS Adventure Camp:**

MS Adventure Camp (MSAC) is held for youth going into grades 4-12 who live in a household with someone with multiple sclerosis (MS). MSAC is a residential camp, hosted overnight over multiple days. Campers will be organized into groups and paired with a volunteer counselor as their lead. Structured programming is offered throughout each day, including recreational camp activities in addition to MS awareness and education.

### **Specific Qualifications:**

- No prior experience of being a camp medical liaison is required, but previous experience working with youth is preferred
- Must be CPR/First Aid certified
- Comfortable and confident working with youth ages 8 to 17
- Must be at least older than 18 years of age and a high school graduate
- Must complete and pass a background check
- Has ability to work and effectively communicate with all types of people
- Ability to solve problems effectively and efficiently
- Must always conduct oneself in a fashion that does not jeopardize the Society's image and models positive behavior to campers
- Trainings/Important Dates
  - Availability to connect virtually with a staff partner on an as-needed basis to receive information specific to MS Adventure Camp
  - Attendance at a virtual MS Adventure Camp Risk Management and Communications Plan pre-event training is required
  - Attendance at an on-site in-person training to take place prior to camper arrival is required
  - Counselors are required to remain at camp for the full duration of the program and will be expected to contribute to a clean-up and check-out process prior to departure
- Other duties as assigned

### **Role Responsibilities:**

- Works closely with Camp Leadership Team to ensure the health and safety of all campers, volunteers, and staff
- Provide direct care to program participants including, but not limited to:
  - Addressing emergency situations under the supervision of the in-site healthcare provider
  - Attending to minor injuries
  - Providing supervision to campers
- Serves as a critical member of the camp community by creating a warm, welcoming, and safe environment
- Work with participants, guests, and volunteers in a kind, safe, and responsible manner
- Acts professionally and has ability to work and effectively communicate with all types of people
- Have a positive, open attitude throughout the duration of the camp experience
